## HOPE: Acts 23:6; 26:6-8; Heb 6:19-20

Hope of resurrection life is certain and it anchors us now.



Remember – the big thing about biblical hope is that it's a certain hope. It is **not** wishful thinking.

We're going to see what we hope in and why that's a big deal.

## Hope

1. What kind of things do you normally hope for?

(Examples: a sunny day, a cooler day(?!), good test results, a new friend, a win, a new game, etc...)

2. There are two things you hope for, one you're not certain will happen and another that you are certain will happen: which are you more excited about? How does certainty change your excitement?

## What we hope in

Paul stood trial in front of lots of councils and people because of what he was preaching about Jesus. We read about it in Acts. Here are two <u>verv</u> short excerpts! (It would be good to look them up too!)

Then Paul, knowing that some of them were Sadducees and the others Pharisees, called out in the Sanhedrin, 'My brothers, I am a Pharisee, descended from Pharisees. I stand on trial because of the hope of the resurrection of the dead.' Acts 23:6 And now it is because of *my hope in what God has promised* our ancestors that I am on trial today. <sup>7</sup> This is the promise our twelve tribes are hoping to see fulfilled as they earnestly serve God day and night. King Agrippa, it is because of this hope that these Jews are accusing me. <sup>8</sup> *Why should any of you consider it incredible that God raises the dead*? Acts 26:6-8

3. What is Paul's hope as he stands trial? (Acts 23:6, in front of the Sanhedrin, the Jewish council.)

4. Who promised resurrection from the dead? (Acts 26:6-8) \_\_\_\_

5. Why does Paul think it's a believable promise, why he can have certain hope? It's about who promises it...

## Why it's a big deal!We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. It enters the inner<br/>sanctuary behind the curtain, 20 where our forerunner, Jesus, has entered on our behalf.<br/>He has become a high priest for ever, in the order of Melchizedek.Heb 6:19-20

6. What does hope do for the soul?

7. To 'enter the inner sanctuary' means to be where God is. Unholy, imperfect people can't go there without dying. Why is it good news that Jesus has gone on our behalf?
